GENERAL

- 1. All rules will be strictly enforced judges decision is final in all instances.
- 2. All pulls will start with a tight chain.
- 3. Distance pull, except Farm Stock and Steel are percentage.
- 4. Any driver refusing to stop when the red flag is given, will automatically be disqualified.

NATPA GENERAL PULLING RULES

- 1. A tractor may pull only once in each class.
- 2. Drivers under 18 years of age must have written parental/guardian permission.
- 3. Drivers must stay on the seat of the tractor at all times. Hands must be on the steering wheel, hand brakes, hand clutch, or throttle at all times during the pull.
- See Wheelie Bar Requirements.
- Any tractor or puller found to be unsafe or illegal may be disqualified or barred from hooking
- 6. No use of alcoholic beverages will be permitted.
- Any part falling off the tractor after being hooked and until the tractor is unhooked will result in disqualification.
- All weights should be secured, as dropped weights are cause for disqualification.
- Contact point of tractor and sled must remain in bounds at all times. Out of bounds will result in disqualification. No measurement will be taken after a disqualification.
- 10. RPM's allowed will be determined by the NATPA RPM Chart. Any tractor not listed will use manufacturer's data.
- 11. Gas, diesel or LP fuels only. No alcohol or nitrous oxide fuels or fuel additives may be used in tractors. Gas is allowed a maximum of 750 specific gravity. All tractors are subject to random fuel checks.
- 12. All tractors are required to have a spark plug wire easily accessible for Tech Crew to check RPM's.
- 13. All side shields must be removed prior to a tractor being inspected by the Tech crew. They may be reattached after the Tech inspection.
- 14. There is no allowance on weight for any class in any Division. Weight of class is maximum weight allowed.
- 15. A finish line must be used at all events. If a tractor exceeds this distance this constitutes a full pull.
- 16. If a class is restarted for any reason, all tractors that are registered in the class and that have already pulled will be allowed to repull.

Wheelie Bar Requirements (SKIDS)

- 1. Wheelie bars are required in Divisions II, III, IV & V and should not be attached to the draw bar in any way.
- 2. Each skid must support at least the weight of the tractor in the heaviest class pulled.
- 3. Skid pads must be at least 5"x5" (minimum) and spaced a minimum of 20" apart, from outside of each skid.
- 4. Skid pad must be no more that 10" off the ground.
- 5. Skid pad must be completely extended 5" past the farthest point of the rear tire (tire radius).
- 6. Tech Crew reserves the right to perform tests at its discretion.

- 2. Stock RPM with all governors hooked up at all times.
- 3. Hot engines, cammed, stroked, ported, etc. will be eliminated from competition. Cylinder boring (common to straighten cylinder walls or to clean up cylinders) will be allowed.

Tractor Tire Limits

Not to exceed 15.5, for Farm Stock Classes only (Div. I).

All other tractors, not to exceed 18.4 with any rim width. No extensions on steel or duals.

Cut tires are allowed, except Div. I and II classes.

The Coffin Block Pedal Tractor, because a small number of them were made and shown to John Deere. John Deere wanted more detail in the engine area before it would be approved. After approval, Eska produced what is called the first John Deere A pedal tractor in 1949 (green). The Coffin Block Pedal Tractor is very rare and less than eight are known to have existed. These tractors were painted red with yellow wheels and sold later as a generic tractors. An original can sell for more than \$25,000. A reproduction can go for as high as \$2,000.
