

GKCTCC Meeting Minutes Nov. 1, 2015, 2:00 p.m. Frontier Village; Adrian, MO

Attendance: 27

Meeting opened with the flag salute at 2:05 P.M.

President Wes Storm welcomed everyone to the meeting. Two guests / new members were present: Tom Bowling of Blue Springs, MO (John Deere B) and Jay Thornburg of Adrian, MO. He mentioned the club had 91 member families for 2015 and if anyone wanted to pay 2016 membership dues, they could do so following the meeting.

June meeting minutes, as published in newsletter, were discussed. Bary Porter moved to accept minutes as written and Phil Addison seconded. Motion passed.

Jay Pruett presented the financial report. An ending balance of \$8,203.13 was reported. He explained expenditures along with revenue in detail. Bryce York moved to accept the financial report as read. Don Hrabik seconded. Motion passed.

Old Business

President Wes Storm reported on the Glenn Ratzlaff Memorial scholarship. Cody Mannville was again awarded a \$500 scholarship to go to Fort Scott Community College in the John Deere Tech program. The scholarship was awarded after the Halloween Parade in Independence, MO.

Don Hrabik advised that the Ag Hall of Fame Board of Governors fee of \$200 for 2016 is coming due and wanted to discuss it. It was moved by Don Hrabik for the club to pay the \$200 fee for the 2016 Ag Hall of Fame Board of Governors. Bary Porter seconded. Motion passed.

A report on the 2015 American Royal Parade was given by Bill Eagleburger. 5 tractors were included and a trailer with the other Deere's. Everyone had a great time and World Series Championship BBQ was available afterwords. It was discussed that attendance was so low due to the club sponsored tractor games at Powell Gardens (featuring John Deere in 2015). This will not be a problem next year as the club sponsored tractor games at Powell Gardens will be moved to the afternoon next year (2016). It is expected the 2016 Am Royal Parade will be at the stadiums again. It was mentioned that parking was a big plus.

New Business

Trivia Answer:

The Model 80 was the first John Deere Tractor with more than 50 drawbar horsepower. The two-cylinder diesel engine on the 80 had a bore and stroke of 6 1/8 x 8 inches, 471 cid, 1125 rpm, compression ratio was 16:1. At the Nebraska Test the 80 tested 60.04 drawbar and 65.33 belt horsepower, setting a new fuel economy record. Only 3485 Model 80's were built from June 27, 1955 through June 11, 1956. The price of a new 1956 Model 80 was \$4205. Shipping weight was 8150 pounds. Several options new to the 80 (over the R): dual live hydraulics, optional PTO with or without hydraulics, hydraulics with or without PTO, and V-4 Pony motor start.
